

## SURREY INDUSTRIAL HISTORY GROUP

SIHG is a group of the Surrey Archaeological Society (SyAS). It grew out of a series of lectures on industrial archaeology held at the University of Surrey in 1975 and the course described in this leaflet is the 43<sup>rd</sup> lecture series.

The group also holds other meetings, arranges visits in Surrey and elsewhere, sponsors research, and undertakes recording and restoration projects. It awards a plaque annually to an outstanding conservation project in Surrey.

SIHG has produced, and continues to revise, a series of guides to industrial archaeological sites in each of the districts in Surrey. It also produces other occasional publications and a quarterly newsletter for members.

SIHG is affiliated to the national Association for Industrial Archaeology. The group was a founder member of the South East Region Industrial Archaeology Conference and participates in the annual SERIAC conference. Members receive a quarterly Newsletter with articles on industrial archaeology of local, national and international interest. There is also a diary section.

### Membership

Ordinary Members of the SIHG pay an Annual Subscription of £12, reduced to £9 for Members of the Surrey Archaeological Society.

Overseas members wishing to receive a printed copy of the Newsletter pay £20, reduced to £12 for the email version.

Associate Members, who must be relatives of Ordinary Members and resident with them, pay an Annual Subscription of £3, reduced to £2 for Members of SyAS.

Junior Members, who must normally be more than 14 and less than 18 years of age or be full-time students, pay an Annual Subscription of £7.

The Annual Subscription for Institutional Members is £14.

Membership begins on receipt of the first subscription and is renewable on 1 April each year.

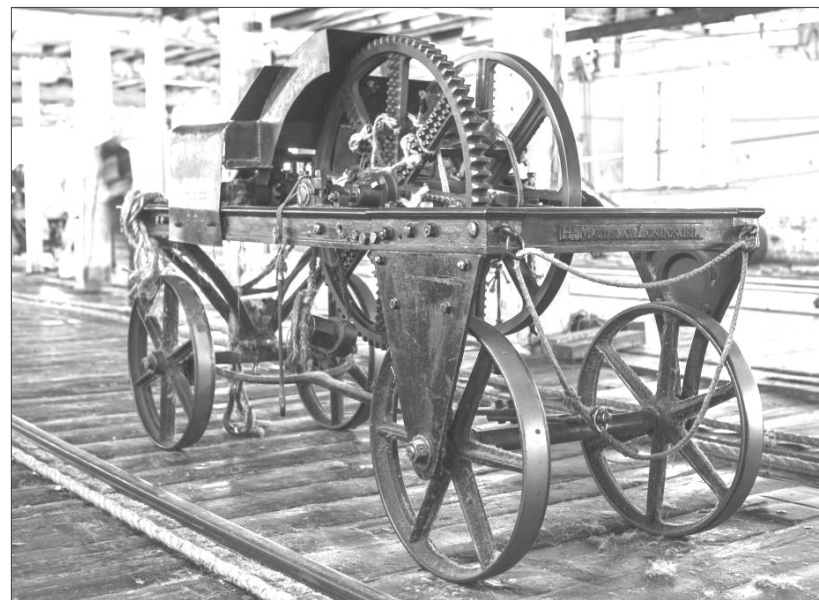
