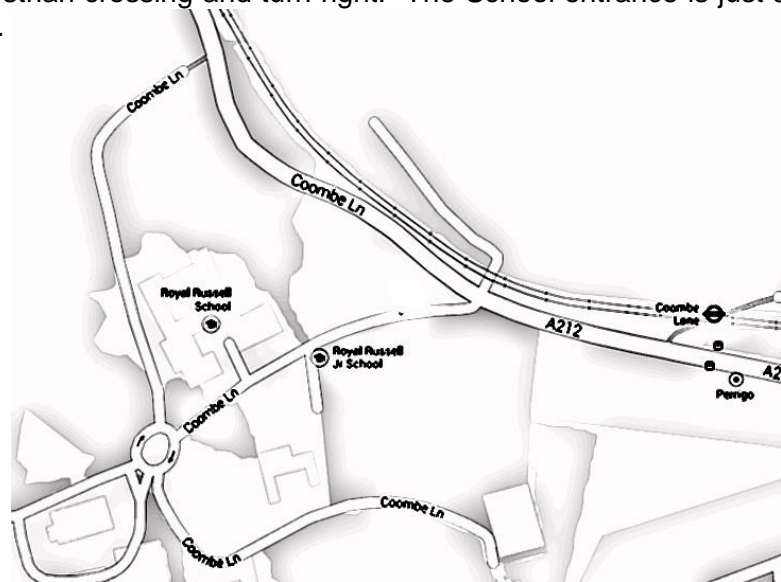


DISPLAYS & STALLS

SERIAC BURSARIES

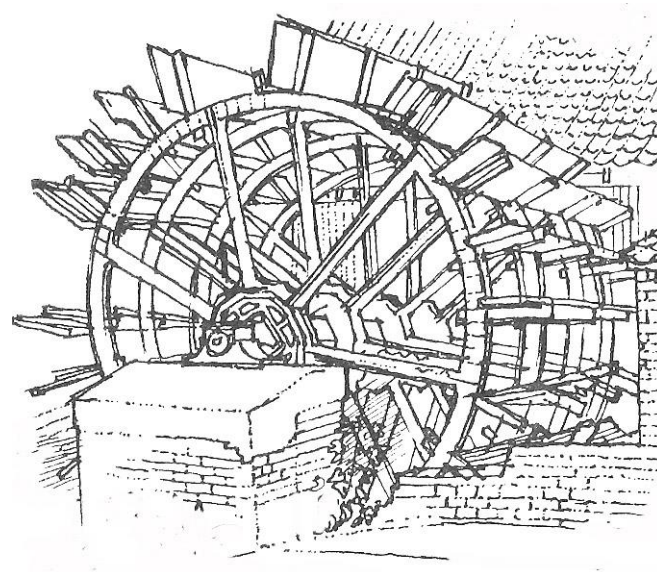
